## **Post of Traditional Buildings Inspector Fixed Term until 31 March 2022**

Thank you for taking an interest in this vacancy with Stirling City Heritage Trust. We are a City Heritage Trust, one of 7 across Scotland, who deliver local projects using funding from Historic Environment Scotland and our local authority. Due to our current funding arrangements, the post is fixed until end March 2022, but there may be the option to continue in post if our application for funding beyond this time is successful.

Based at the charity hub at the Barracks, we are close to public transport links, city centre facilities and parking. The HES Engine Shed is also our next-door neighbour. The Trust offers grants, undertakes outreach and education, funds apprenticeships and operates the Traditional Buildings Health Check.

Due to Covid-19, first interviews will be via zoom. It is likely that candidates who progress to the second stage will be asked to meet us outside in Stirling for further assessment.
